

BIODEGRADABLE ORIGAMI PLANT POTS

These pots are great for sowing seeds on a windowsill. Once you have a healthy seedling, plant it straight into the ground, where the pot will decompose.

You will need: A sheet of A4 paper. Scrap paper, destined for recycling is perfect.

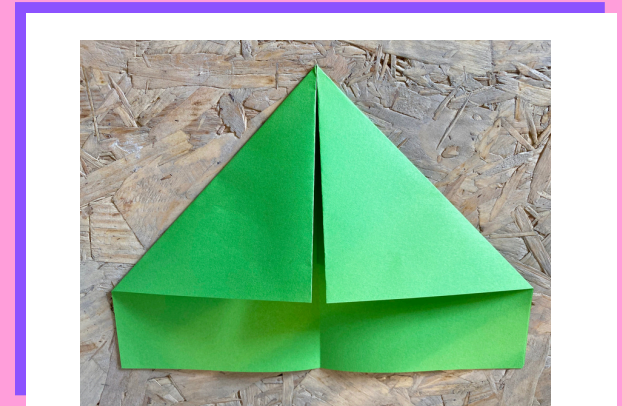
Top tips: Lean on a flat surface & make your folds as neat as you can.



1 Fold paper in half (into A5 size).



2 Fold in half again, then unfold.



3 With the folded over edge at the top, fold the corners down to meet on the central crease.



- 4** Fold up the top sheet from the bottom, until it meets the bottom of the corner folds.



- 5** Fold upwards again.



- 6** Turn the paper over.



- 7** Fold both sides into the central crease.



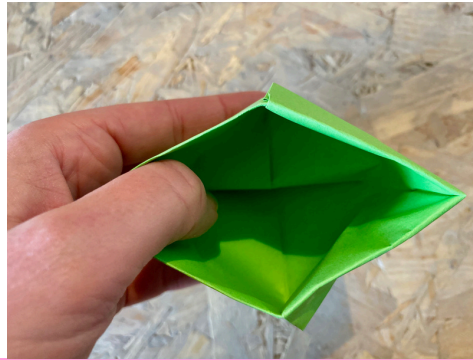
- 8** Fold the bottom in half.



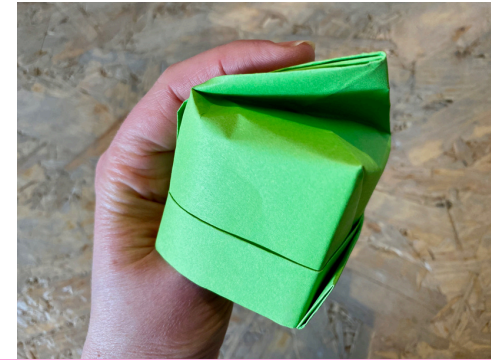
- 9** Fold it upwards again.



10 Fold to make a crease across the square part. Press firmly, then unfold.



11 Find the gap and open up your pot.



12 Bend the triangular flap down.



13 Put your fingers inside and press it flat.



14 Your pot is now ready for sewing a seed!
